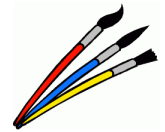

## Eligibility

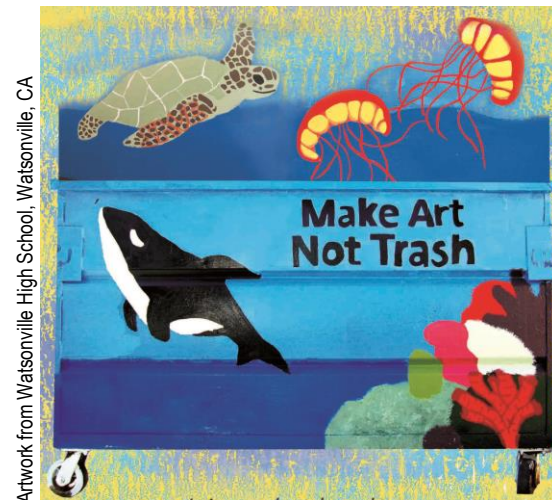
- All pre-K – 12<sup>th</sup> grade students from all U.S. states and territories are welcome to submit artwork
- Public, private, charter, and home schools are eligible to participate
- One entry per student

## Description

*Artwork should illustrate the general theme of how zero waste on land helps to protect the health of our local watersheds and ocean.*

## Criteria for Art

- Each entry must be on a single sheet of paper no bigger than 11"x14"
- Do not laminate the paper
- Any art medium may be used
- Artwork must be hand-drawn by the student
- No brand names should be included in the artwork
- Label each entry on the back in pencil with the student's name, grade, teacher's name, school name, address, and telephone number
- Student will be notified if their artwork is selected
