### Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council

July 19, 2019

#### **Council Input Provided on CINMS Management Plan Revision Scoping Phase**

At their meeting on July 19, 2019, the CINMS advisory council received an update on the upcoming start of the first public phase of the management plan revision process. The council discussed their role in helping to raise awareness about the opportunity for the public to provide scoping comments online or in person at two public meetings. More specifically, council members provided a variety of suggestions related to the format to be used for the scoping meetings, and the type of information that could be helpful to the public.

### Greater Farallones National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council

#### **Recommendations adopted regarding the Tomales Bay native oyster**

Greater Farallones National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council adopted the recommendations of its Tomales Bay Native Oyster Restoration Working Group, which included recommendations for population enhancement of the native oyster *Ostrea lurida*; policy and planning for restoration including site selection; monitoring, evaluation, and adaptive management for restoration; research and data needs; and education and outreach. The council passed a resolution to forward the recommendations to the sanctuary for consideration along with the working group meeting notes.

### Olympic Coast National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council

#### **Resolution accepting recommendations regarding OCNMS as an ONMS Sentinel Site for Ocean Acidification**

The OCNMS AC passed a unanimous resolution to accept the recommendations of the Ocean Acidification Sentinel Site working group (OASes WG) wherein the OASesWG recommended that OCNMS should be formally designated as an ONMS Sentinel Site for Ocean Acidification as part of the greater Olympic Coast Ocean Acidification Sentinel Site with the goals and objectives adopted by the working group; a Steering Committee should be convened to further refine the deliverables of the Olympic Coast Ocean Acidification Sentinel Site; and OCNMS should serve as the coordinating entity and provide staff support to the Olympic Coast Ocean Acidification Sentinel Site.
